Your Pre-Remodel CHECKLIST

Work your estimates into the budget sheet inside this workbook (so you can properly compare)
Choose a start date that works for your schedule
Set an agenda with the contractor(s)
Get the project outlined in writing by the contractor and signed by all parties to prevent mistakes; inclue additions and budget changes along the way
Purchase as much of the material needs up-front to avoid possible lag time
Set up a payment schedule before the start of the project
Plan ahead and be prepared if a portion of your home will be out of commission during any part of the project

Here, we've broken down common remodeling costs with ranges of what percent of your total budget each could take. Use this worksheet as a guide for your own project, but remember that your project will be unique.
